PROJECT SUMMARY

Advertising the Self - Marketing Vocational Education in Arts and Design (#advertisingtheself) was planned and implemented by HTBLVwA Graz - Ortweinschule (AT), the Soares dos Reis School of Arts, Porto (PT), the Liceo Artistico "Scuola del Libro", Urbino (IT), and the Technikum Fototechniczne, Warsaw (PL).

The participating schools in **#advertisingtheself** all offer specialized educational pathways in Arts and Design. Vocational qualifications in specific fields such as Graphics and Communication Design, Film and Multimedia Art, Photography, Product Design, Book Design, Ceramics Art Craft and Jewellery Design can be obtained by students aged 14+.

Project objectives

After graduation, students need to find their place on the job market, either being employed or working free-lance. In any case, marketing and advertising the self is essential in Arts and Design to make oneself seen and heard and to stick out from the rest. Relevant skills and competences need to be improved.

Students involved in **#advertisingtheself** were aware of the fact that collaborating with colleagues and students from other European countries does not only bring in new perspectives on effective self-marketing, but also offers the chance to practice English in the context of one's field of education. And since European projects require dissemination of activities and results, they offer plenty of opportunities to explore and implement diverse marketing instruments.

#advertisingtheself specifically aimed at:

- Developing skills and competences of self-marketing of students to be able to present themselves as competitive participants on the labour market.
- Developing awareness of the self as an artist through autobiographical approaches and self-portraits in respective fields of arts and design (from photography to paintings).
- Fostering digital competences and the use of ICT to be able to communicate and present oneself effectively online.
- Engaging students in disseminating processes and project outputs.
- Fostering European exchange, intercultural communication and foreign language acquisition.
- Supporting entrepreneurship and the acquisition of foreign languages in vocational contexts (CLIL).

Activities and products

#advertisingtheself mainly centred around 4 short-term exchanges of groups of pupils. The project was laid out over a period of 36 months and 4 workshops (Learning Activities), one in each country. The brochure at hand portraits the outcomes of the four learning activities as seen by the students who participated.

The Soares dos Reis School of Arts was officially established in January 1884 in Oporto city in the north of Portugal and will be 135 years old this year. This school is geared to art education and is a non-profit public institution. Annually around 900 students follow the school `s different educational pathways. The learning of the students is guided by a team of teachers with specific and pedagogical training in the arts as well as teachers of special techniques in various technological areas that are a valuable heritage and an asset for the school teaching quality. The school currently offers: Audiovisual Communication, Advertisement Design, Product Design, Artistic Production and one professional course of 2D/3D Animation. These courses, directed to the level of secondary education, take 3 years (10°, 11° and 12°) to complete. The EASR is a specialized school of Art Education with an emphasis on vocational education.

The Technikum Fototechniczne Warsaw, Poland, is the largest and the oldest Polish school that educates students in the field of photography, including graphics, multimedia projects and movie-making. On graduation students are prepared to pass Matura exam (an exam which entitles one to enter University) and vocational exams that verify professional qualifications. The school employs 60+ fully qualified teachers, including 22 teachers of vocational training. The Phototechnical High School provides training for 600+ students aged 15+. The school also runs weekend qualification courses for adults. Our school cooperates with about 80 reputable companies dealing with photography and related branches, where internships of our students are arranged. Our institution participates actively in educational and cultural events conducted in the city. For many years the school has been taking part in different European projects.



Workshops' summary

Europass CV


When applying for a job, students need to prepare a Curriculum Vitae in order to be considered for a chosen position. While there are many different templates available, the one prepared by the European Union is easy to use and widely accepted. Students were introduced to the format of the online CV creator and received guidelines as far as the content is concerned. Each participant created their own Europass CV that can be modified on demand.

The workshop was complemented by a meeting with an expert in self presentation. The students learnt how to behave during a job interview to make the best impression on the potential employer.

Portrait with an attribute

You have only one chance to make the first impression. As a young artist one wants to be perceived in a particular way and that is why students were invited to create portraits with attributes - objects that were meaningful to them and influential for their works.

First, they were invited to take each other's photos in studios. This was followed by editing with the use of Adobe Photoshop. These images can be used on the students' websites to help them introduce themselves to their potential clients.


Together with other art students from Portugal, Poland and Italy we did various workshops during the project week in Warsaw. We teamed up in small groups of students from different countries and with different mother tongues. In those groups we did some activities like writing a CV, attending some workshops for job interviews, and doing unusual self-portraits with the cameras provided. Besides that we went to museums and tourist attractions with all other students and explored the city Warsaw.

Since you are tempted to spend most of your time with the Austrian students, the biggest challenge for me was trying to get in touch with the students from other countries and break the language barrier, which I did relatively well. A big advantage of doing Erasmus projects is that you can see new places and discover them with others. I met people I wouldn't have met otherwise. 






LORENZ BRANDL

My name is Lorenz and I attend the fourth grade at the Ortweinschule in Graz, with focus on graphic design and communication design. I like to solve design challenges using different techniques and materials, such as drawing analogue, digital illustration via Adobe Illustrator, or photography and photomanipulation via Adobe Photoshop.

Between November 18th and 22nd, eight students from Ortweinschule, including me, visited Warsaw to participate in a workshop called "AdvertisingTheSelf". Together with 24 other students from 3 different countries we listened to a lecture about how to present ourselves in job interviews and CVs and executed some photography-tasks, like shooting studio-portraits.

Apart from that we spent a lot of time in different parts of Warsaw visiting monuments, the National Museum, and the Wilanów Garden of Lights.

The biggest advantage of working in an international group is the difference in experiences and influences. Every conversation reveals new cultural and educational differences, which help you change your point and view and broaden your field of vision.

Those differences can also become a challenge sometimes, when communication relies on a certain amount of knowledge or experience in those fields. Nevertheless, these small inconveniences are easy to solve through further communication and explanation.

The participation in this project allowed me to develop:

- 1. Applied English skills in conversation and my field of work;
- 2. Describing myself and my skills in a CV;
- 3. How to shake hands correctly in a job interview.

LICEO ARTISTICO SCUOLA DEL LIBRO Cinema and Photography



Workshops' summary

Social media content

In order to develop the students' skills concerning the social media promotion of their artistic work, two workshops in photography and video were held at Soares dos Reis School of Arts focused on the creation of audiovisual content for social networks.

In the photography workshop students learned how to make professional looking of an artistic object, either for social networking use, online portfolio or print portfolio. In the photography studio students learned how to adjust lightning, cameras and the set to achieve good quality images.

In the video workshop students developed a short "self-marketing" movie expressing the artist perspective of his project.

Visual Communication

This workshop goal was to show how to make professional communication materials (e.g. presentations - presentations, text documents, CV's) concerning visual communication principles and guidelines, such as making good use of typography, color, images or layout.

Express Yourself Poster (at Casa da Imagem)

This workshop goal was to do a poster using graphic assets (mainly advertising items from the archives of Teófilo Rego, a very well known photographer of Porto. The result should emphasize individual aspects of the student background.

Workshops' summary


Creating Online Portfolios and non-digital Artistic Expression

The third Learning Activity was hosted by Ortweinschule in Graz, Austria, from 4th to 8th April 2022. The workshop for students was integrated into classes in the fields of Graphics and Communication Design and Film and MultiMedia Art and held by teachers of these departments.

Activities students workshop

Part 1 of the workshop concentrated on creating self-portraits using non-digital techniques. Students got an art historical introduction on major examples of self-portraits over the centuries and underlying approaches and concepts. Students were asked to face paint each other followed by taking photographs of the results. The portraits were then painted over by the students to bring in their subjective view.

Part 2 of the workshop concentrated on creating an online portfolio using wordpress. The students learnt about downloading and setting up wordpress, implementing basic layouting options and filling their designs with information about themselves (using text, self-portraits, pictures of their works, videos).

My name is Kodituwakku Balasuriyage Nethmi Taruka, but my friends just call me Neth. I'm eighteen years old and I live with my family in Italy. I attend "Scuola Del Libro" art school in Urbino, where I'm in my fifth and last year in the illustration and animation section.

In my free time, I like to watch tv shows and documentaries, hang out with my friends and take photos of them.

During our Erasmus in Graz, we participated in a project called "Advertising the Self" that included two workshops that had the aim of working on and publicizing ourselves.

The first one consisted in realizing a self-portrait through non-digital techniques like body painting: first, we divided into couples, pairing up with someone from a different country than ours and painting on each other's faces. After this we got our photos taken and printed as posters on which we then could get creative with different drawing techniques.

The second workshop was all about promoting ourselves and our works, so each one of us created a website dedicated to ourselves and our "portfolio", with the help of a program called WordPress. We then had a small presentation of our works.

Being this the first Erasmus for a lot of us, we found ourselves in a situation that required a quick communication that we didn't study in books, so we took advantage of our English skills and even learned some sentences in the other students' native languages. We had the possibility of confronting our habits with theirs to look at the world from a different perspective. Initially, a lot of people were shy of talking for fear of making some mistakes or being judged, but at the end of our stay, everyone bonded, embracing their differences.

Surely the most precious insight I gained from this experience was being braver and more independent. Before the Erasmus even started, I was so concerned about a lot of things like "will I be social enough?" or "will they understand my English?", "what if I get lost?". In the end, everything just worked out on its own: everyone was so eager to make new friends and gain new pieces of knowledge that I didn't even have the time to get insecure about being social! I even found myself doing a lot of things that I could never imagine myself doing before this experience, like volunteering to make a public speech, throwing myself off of a 64 meters slide or being able to get a tram completely alone in a foreign country. Even though my stay in Austria was so short, I felt more grown and experienced.





During the Erasmus+ Learning Activity, I was working on creating my portfolio and on an animated CV. I made works mostly by myself, but I used some help from students and teachers.


The biggest advantage was meeting new people and getting to know their culture. The biggest challenge was to understand how we should be doing portfolio and CV because part of it was explained in Italian.


